18650 Lithium Ion batteries.

## **Petersen Rock Garden**

If you are up for an eleven hour drive through eastern Oregon, you can stop by a very special place. Just off highway 97 north of Bend, OR is a little known roadside stop called the Petersen Rock Garden.

The rock garden was started by Rasmus Petersen in 1935 and was faithfully added to until 1952. Rasmus was not a rockhound in a traditional sense. He loved to collect rocks, but could not identify any of the rocks that he used in his construction projects. Some of his projects included an American flag, the Statue of Liberty, the London Bridge, a small chapel, fairy castles, and much more.

The rock garden is still semi open to the public. You put your admission fee into a box at the entrance, but no one is there officially to greet you or give you a tour. I happened to visit on a day that a tour bus had stopped, but by the time we finished viewing the spectacular garden, the doors to the museum were locked and we almost had the gate closed on us while our car was still in the parking lot. I would have liked to stay longer, but fate was not on our side.

All of the rocks at the garden were found within 100 miles of the property. Oregon is a treasure of ancient volcanos and so many of the rocks are igneous in nature. A red lava rock, known



locally as cinder rock, is the most widely used rock at the garden. There are also pieces of obsidian from the nearby fields and pieces of agate which are also in an abundance around Bend, OR.

The garden is 87 years old and is still an impressive place. Please visit if you can.

The ORE-CUTTS (named after William Orcutt) was first published in 1966. Member Helen Azevedo was the first editor. The Orcutt Mineral Society was founded in 1958, and was also named after Orcutt who was a geologist and civil engineer who worked in the Santa Maria Valley as a District Manager for Union Oil Company in 1888. In 1889, William Orcutt discovered the mineral and fossil wealth of the La Brea Tar Pits on the property of Captain Alan Hancock in Los Angeles. The La Brea Tar Pits are one of the most significant fossil finds in paleontological history.

OMS is a non-profit organization dedicated to stimulating an interest in the earth sciences. The club offers educational programs, field trips, scholarships, and other opportunities for families and individuals to pursue an interest in the collecting and treatment of lapidary materials, fossils, gems, minerals, and other facets of the Earth Sciences. In addition, another goal of this Society is to promote good fellowship and proper ethics in pursuit of the Society's endeavors. Operating Rules have been set forth

to guide the officers and members of the Society in accomplishing these aims. Affiliations of the OMS include American Federation of Mineral Societies, and California Federation of Mineral Societies.
