

Terminology - Phosphates

The classification of phosphates in the mineral world refers to compounds containing the element phosphorous. Phosphorous atoms are generally very active. They have 5 electrons in their outer ring but would really like 8 electrons to be stable. Therefore they fill their outer ring with electrons from other elements, mainly oxygen and metals. These bonds form quite an array of compounds. There are over 150 different phosphate minerals present in our rock and mineral world. I don't recognize most of them, but the one that I have heard of is turquoise.

Turquoise is a phosphate that is bonded to aluminum and copper. The copper gives the turquoise its blue color. Some turquoise is green in tint, but that is usually an indication of an iron impurity. The more blue your turquoise, the more pure it is.

The native peoples of North America have been mining turquoise since about 200 BC. It is usually found in a vein like copper. In fact, turquoise is often a byproduct of copper mining.

The Southwest United States is a rich source of turquoise. You can find turquoise in Arizona, Colorado, New Mexico, and Nevada. You can also find deposits right in our backyard. San Bernardino, Imperial, and Inyo counties in California have deposits. There is even one mine in California that is still producing today. It is the Apache Canyon Mine located between Barstow and Las Vegas.

The ORE-CUTTS (named after William Orcutt) was first published in 1966. Member Helen Azevedo was the first editor. The Orcutt Mineral Society was founded in 1958, and was also named after Orcutt who was a geologist and civil engineer who worked in the Santa Maria Valley as a District Manager for Union Oil Company in 1888. In 1889, William Orcutt discovered the mineral and fossil wealth of the La Brea Tar Pits on the property of Captain Alan Hancock in Los Angeles. The La Brea Tar Pits are one of the most significant fossil finds in paleontological history.

OMS is a non-profit organization dedicated to stimulating an interest in the earth sciences. The club offers educational programs, field trips, scholarships, and other opportunities for families and individuals to pursue an interest in the collecting and treatment of lapidary materials, fossils, gems, minerals, and other facets of the Earth Sciences. In addition, another goal of this Society is to promote good fellowship and proper ethics in pursuit of the Society's endeavors. Operating Rules have been set forth to guide the officers and members of the

Society in accomplishing these aims. Affiliations of the OMS include American Federation of Mineral Societies, and California Federation of Mineral Societies.
