OMS Scholarship Award to Connor Perkins



The Orcutt Mineral Society was happy to present the scholarship award to Connor Perkins from Cuesta College at our general meeting on May 9th. He is pictured here with his professor, Dr. Emily Cane.

Connor is hoping to transfer to UC San Diego to finish his degree work. He hasn't decided where his geology career will take him, but he expressed an interest in working at the Scripps Institute of Oceanography and use his geology education to discover rock formations at the bottom of the ocean. He will put the OMS scholarship to good use.

Connor was a very polite and bright young man and we all look forward to seeing his discoveries and research in the near future.

Terminology - Silicates

Silicates are a class of mineral that consists of silicon and oxygen bonded one or more metallic elements. They are the most complex of the minerals since they are a result of interlocking electrons. Up to a dozen or more elements can be interlocked at the same time.

Tourmaline is a familiar silicate. It is a crystalline mineral group in which boron silicate is compounded with elements such as aluminum, iron, magnesium, sodium, lithium, or potassium to create many colors. There are 32 known types of tourmaline and all are very chemically complex. For instance, the chemical formula for the tourmaline, Schorl, is $NaFe_3Al_6Si_6O_{18}(BO_3)_3(OH)_3OH$. The formulas are complex, but the crystals are simply beautiful.

Other silicates that are not as glamorous as tourmaline are feldspars and micas. Feldspars are aluminosilicate minerals (aluminum and silicon) that contain calcium, sodium, or potassium. Micas are also aluminosilicates, but they form unusual crystals that cleave into sheets.

Talc is familiar addition to the Mohs hardness kit. Talc is a hydrous magnesium silicate with a hardness of 1. The chemical formula for talc is $Mg_3Si_4O_{10}(OH)_2$. It is big chemical compound for such a modest and ordinary mineral.

The ORE-CUTTS (named after William Orcutt) was first published in 1966. Member Helen Azevedo was the first editor. The Orcutt Mineral Society was founded in 1958, and was also named after Orcutt who was a geologist and civil engineer who worked in the Santa Maria Valley as a District Manager for Union Oil Company in 1888. In 1889, William Orcutt discovered the mineral and fossil wealth of the La Brea Tar Pits on the property of Captain Alan Hancock in Los Angeles. The La Brea Tar Pits are one of the most significant fossil finds in paleontological history.

OMS is a non-profit organization dedicated to stimulating an interest in the earth sciences. The club offers educational programs, field trips, scholarships, and other opportunities for families and individuals to pursue an interest in the collecting and treatment of lapidary materials, fossils, gems, minerals, and other facets of the Earth Sciences. In addition, another goal of this Society is to promote good fellowship and proper ethics in pursuit of the Society's endeavors. Operating Rules have been set forth

to guide the officers and members of the Society in accomplishing these aims. Affiliations of the OMS include American Federation of Mineral Societies, and California Federation of Mineral Societies.
