## GEOLOGY TOUR OF THE AVILA BEACH AREA - SEPTEMBER 21, 2019


Four folks showed up for the field trip. Geary Sheffer and Dick Bazzell from OMS, and Lisa King and Jay \_\_\_\_ from the Santa Lucia club. WE waited at the parking area until about 9:10, and headed for Stop 2. While looking at the pillow basalts, a former teacher from Bonita Elementary school, Dirk Engens, asked to join us. So a total of 6 of us enjoyed the 2 1/2 hour tour under a lovely, clear, warm, blue sky. Dick found a neat boulder (~12" x 8" x 8") of Brecciated Jasper down the hill and in the creek bed at our jasper stop.

**STOP 1**—Meet at the **Bob Jones Trail Head** on Ontario Road near Sycamore Mineral Springs. Review geological and topographical maps of the area.

Discuss the subduction of the Pacific Plate and subsequent movement of the North American Plate. As we proceed into San Luis Bay, note the uplifted layers of Miocene marine Monterey Shale especially south of the road.

**STOP 2--- Port San Luis**. Observe the Pillow Basalts that were originally formed in the ocean and "scraped off" onto the continent as the subduction of the Pacific Plate took place about 30 million years ago. This activity took place about where Palm Springs is located. About 298 miles of offset have taken place in the last (approximately ) 25 million years.


**STOP 3— Looking south across Avila Beach at Fossil Point.** Around the first point you can see south of the Avila Pier, are more Miocene-aged (about 15 million years old) extrusive igneous rocks. These are rhyolites that have been fractured due to fault action, and have been re-cemented by chalcedony (cryptocrystalline quartz). These Brecciated Rhyolites are called "DeeDeeite" in honor of their discoverer—DeeDee Magri, an honorary member of OMS. These rocks that can fluoresce in up to 3 different colors are usually accessible only at 0 to minus tides.



**STOP 1** - Subduction of the Pacific Plate and subsequent movement of the North American Plate.

STOP 4—Gopher Glen Apple Farm. We stopped here for fresh Apple Cider and a sampling of the currently available apples. My all-time favorite apple "Jonalicious" should be available today. See Canyon has a special micro-climate that is especially beneficial to growing apples. Most of See Canyon Road is in the Mid-Miocene aged Monterey Formation, one of the most extensive formations in California.

STOP 5—Near the Perfumo Canyon Road/See Canyon Road juncture. Though this area is still in Monterey Formation, brecciated jasper may be found mostly in drainage ditches from here to the other side to the other side of the crest of the hill.

# STOP 6—Highest point on Perfumo Canyon Road. This is to me, one of the finest views in San Luis Obispo County. On a clear day, the Morros, perhaps the most impressive geological feature in SLO County can be plainly seen from Morro Rock to Cerro San Luis (and beyond). According to the book: Mountains of Fire by Sharon Lewis Dickerson, the Morros were formed near where Palm Springs is about 25 million years ago as the Pacific Plate was subducting beneath the North American Plate. The Morros are made of Dacite (Rhyo-Dacite Porphry),


